

## ACADEMIC RANKINGS

### CLASS OF 2010

St. Mary's University School of Law has a tradition of strict grading. The faculty prohibits awarding the grades of *A*, *A-* and *B+* to more than 20% of the students in a first-year course. Because of this limit and because we do not give *A+*s, few students can maintain an *A* average. Our grading scheme is described below.

#### Letter-Grade System

#### Grading Regulations

The median grade in all first-year courses must be a *C+*.

No less than 10% and no more than 20% of the grades must be *A*'s, *A-*'s or *B+*'s.

No fewer than 10% and no more than 20% of the grades must be *C-*'s, *D*'s, or *F*'s.

Listed below are the percentile rankings for the class. The list includes cumulative grade-point averages earned through the spring semester of 2008. Also listed is the letter grade equivalent of each average. A total of 307 students were included in the calculations.
