**Registration** We look forward to your participation in this summer's Innsbruck program. In early April, final course registration forms were sent to all students who had previously applied to the program. If you have not yet returned your form, please do so as soon as possible. You may e-mail the information to Ms. Caroline Buckley at [cbuckley@stmarytx.edu](mailto:cbuckley@stmarytx.edu) or call her at 1-800-INTL-LAW; we use information gathered from the registration forms for ordering the appropriate number of books.

**Letter of Good Standing** Non-St. Mary's students will need to provide a letter from their home law school indicating that they are in good academic standing. The letter should be dated *after May 31, 2010*. This letter should be sent to Ms. Catherine Mery, Registrar, St. Mary's University School of Law, San Antonio, TX 78228.

**Tuition** Tuition of \$884 per credit hour must be paid to St. Mary's University no later than Friday, June 18<sup>th</sup>. A billing statement will be sent to you following receipt of your final registration form. If you plan to leave early for Europe, you need to make arrangements for your tuition to be paid on or before June 20. **Book Purchases** Enclosed is a list of required books for each course. *You must purchase your books in the United States and bring them with you to Innsbruck.*

Visiting students may order their books online from the St. Mary's University Bookstore at [www.rattlerbooks.com](http://www.rattlerbooks.com). Some titles may be available from other bookstores, but the St. Mary's University Bookstore is the exclusive seller of photocopied course packs for the Innsbruck program. The Bookstore will make every effort to fill orders promptly, but you should not wait until the last minute to place book orders. If you plan to leave for Austria at the end of June, you should order your books *no later than* the beginning of June. For additional information, you can call the bookstore at (210) 436-3406.

**Study Aids** Commercial outlines for American law school courses are not available in Austria. If you plan on using such materials in connection with your Innsbruck studies, you must purchase them in the United States and take them with you.

**Reading Assignments** If your schedule allows, read and brief as many of your assignments as possible before arriving in Innsbruck. Reading assignments for some courses are printed at the beginning of the photocopied materials for that subject. For most other courses, syllabi will be included with your books when you receive them, and/or will be posted on our website.

**Luggage Issues** If you plan to travel in Europe prior to your arrival in Innsbruck, luggage can be checked at a train station and picked up later en route to Innsbruck. Costs vary but will probably be in the neighborhood of a euro or two per bag per day. Alternatively, you can take your luggage to a train station and have it shipped to Innsbruck; when you arrive in Innsbruck, it will be waiting for you at the train station (assuming that you have accurately communicated your request to the staff at the train station from which the luggage was shipped). The cost of shipping your luggage by train tends to be reasonable if you are on the continent, but high if you fly into London and ship the luggage across the English Channel.

**ISIC.** An International Student Identity Card may be useful for obtaining discounts on a number of activities (up to 33,000), including entrance fees to some museums. If you are interested, check out the STA Travel website. Students from the St. Mary's campus can obtain an ISIC from the Student Life office for \$22.00 with a St. Mary's I.D. and one other form of photo identification, and two passport photos. Health insurance for international travel is included with this card. See accompanying brochure or website for details.

**Maps of Europe** You may find it useful to have with you in Europe a better map of the continent than you are likely to find in a guidebook or to receive from Eurail. More detailed planning maps are available from various sources, including AAA, bookstores, and web sites such as Ricksteves.com.

**State Department Information Sheet** With the April mailing, we enclosed a copy of the most recent State Department Information Sheet for Austria. To date, there have not been any changes to that information. If you care to check for updates, go to: <http://travel.state.gov>.

**Exchange Rate** Like many countries within the EU, Austria now uses the Euro as its currency. Fees and exchange rates on ATM and credit card transactions can vary, and it is worth investigating these in advance. It is not necessary to exchange money before leaving the U.S., although you might want to bring a small amount of cash in Euros. Currency exchange agencies operating at airports typically charge higher fees than you would otherwise pay, and the exchange rates can be unfavorable compared to the overall market.

**Next Mailing** Information relating to luggage, currency, addresses and telephone numbers, arrival in Innsbruck, and other matters will be forwarded to you in early June.
