St. Mary's University School of Law has a tradition of strict grading. The faculty prohibits awarding the grades of *A* or *A-* to more than 15% of the students in an upper-level course. Because of this limit and because we do not give *A+s*, few students can maintain an *A* average. Our grading scheme is described below.
