St. Mary's University School of Law has a tradition of strict grading. The faculty prohibits awarding the grades of *A* or *A-* to more than 15% of the students in a first-year course. Because of this limit and because we do not give *A+s*, few students can maintain an *A* average. Our grading scheme is described below.

Letter-Grade System	Grading Regulations
A 4.00	Median Grade must be a <i>B-</i> .
A- 3.67	No more than 15% of grades may be <i>A</i> 's or <i>A-</i> 's.
B+ 3.33	No more than 15% of grades may be <i>C-</i> 's, <i>D</i> 's, or <i>F</i> 's.
B 3.00	Median Grade is on a "sliding scale" in classes of 20 or fewer.
